

**CPI:**  
**Nonviolent Crisis Intervention® Instructor Certification Program**

The *Nonviolent Crisis Intervention®* training program is a safe, non-harmful behavior management system designed to help educators provide for the best *Care, Welfare, Safety, and Security*<sup>SM</sup> of confrontational, disruptive, or potentially out-of-control students, even during their most violent moments.

**Day One**

**Introductory Seminar**

On the first day of training, staff will learn:

- Preventive measures to recognize the identifiable stages of escalation of individuals in a crisis moment.
- Corresponding staff responses to help the person(s) de-escalate.
- Nonverbal and verbal intervention strategies for managing the disruptive behavior.
- CPI's *Personal Safety Techniques*<sup>SM</sup> to maximize student and staff safety if the aggressive behavior becomes physical.

**Day Two**

**Comprehensive Workshop**

On the second day of training:

- Concepts introduced in Day One are reinforced.
- Understanding and development of team intervention strategies and techniques are emphasized.
- Time is allowed for extensive demonstration and practice of safe physical control techniques as a last resort, if the out-of-control student becomes violent and a danger to self or others.
- Instruction is provided in the use of debriefing and documentation skills after the crisis situations, which can assist the student in learning from his or her behavior and help, avoid similar situations in the future.

**Days Three and Four**

**Instructor Certification**

The third and fourth day of the program focus on:

- Effective instructional methods for teaching the program to staff.
- An in-depth understanding of the program curriculum.
- How to deal with the resistant participant.
- The reinforcement of all desired content concepts.
- Extensive practice of all intervention strategies and techniques.

To become certified as Instructors, staff must demonstrate their ability to teach the program through a practicum activity; demonstrate their ability to teach the physical techniques through a competency-based assessment; complete a written certification exam; attend the entire 24-hour training program; and demonstrate an attitude compatible with the program philosophy of *Care, Welfare, Safety, and Security*<sup>SM</sup> for all involved in a crisis.
