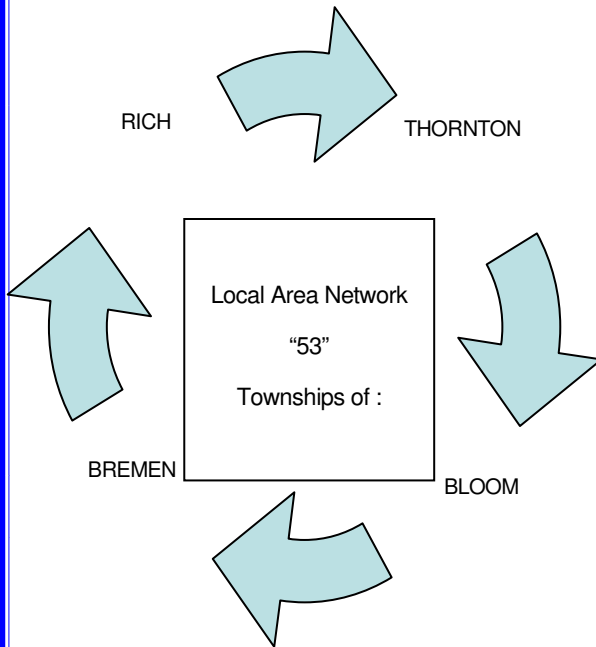

Review of McKinney Vento homeless education requirements, homelessness issues and community resources available to school districts as well as funding available to help defray some of the costs of providing service to homeless students.

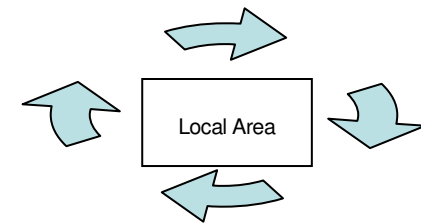
